

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Hereinafter referred to as “the MoU”

Entered into Between

NAMIBIA CIVIL AVIATION AUTHORITY of the Republic of
Namibia

(hereinafter referred to as “NCAA”, and represented by Ms. Angeline
Simana as duly authorised thereto).

AND

THE CIVIL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION OF CHINA

Hereinafter referred to as “CAAC”, and represented by Mr. Li Jian as duly
authorised thereto).

(NCAA and CAAC hereinafter jointly referred to as the “Parties”)

ON

COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF CIVIL AVIATION SAFETY



THE CIVIL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION OF CHINA (CAAC) AND THE
NAMIBIA CIVIL AVIATION AUTHORITY (NCAA),

- a) Basing on the fact that the Peoples Republic of China and the Republic of Namibia are Parties to the Convention on International Civil Aviation signed at Chicago on the 7th of December 1944 and are members of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) created by the said Convention;
- b) Attaching great importance to the China-Namibia relations in civil aviation and their effective collaboration and desiring to strengthen and broaden friendly relations and mutual understanding between the respective aviation authorities and aviation-related institutions and organizations;
- c) Considering that CAAC desires to share its capacity and expertise in various aviation fields and is willing to render assistance to NCAA in order to enhance the latter's levels of skills, expertise and operations;
- d) Recognizing the interest of both sides in furthering exchanges and cooperation in the field of civil aviation;
- e) Considering that such exchanges and cooperation are essentially meant to promote safe, effective and efficient and sustainable development of air transportation within and between China and the Namibia and to facilitate cooperation of both sides through exchanges of experiences and information sharing with a view to encouraging harmonization of standards.

NOW, therefore,

**HAVE EXPRESSED A COMMON INTEREST IN DEVELOPING
COOPERATION IN VARIOUS FIELDS OF CIVIL AVIATION:**

1. The two sides intend to strengthen their future technical exchanges and cooperation on such matters as related to aviation safety, with a view to supporting regulatory cooperation and harmonization.
2. The two sides intend to have cooperation in the following areas:
 - 2.1 Aviation safety and security management, such as
 - a) Airworthiness approvals of civil aeronautical products;
 - b) Environmental developments and testing;
 - c) Aviation maintenance organizations;
 - d) Flight operations and crew members;
 - e) Flight simulators usage;
 - f) Aviation personnel training and establishment; and
 - 2.2 Other areas of mutual interest in civil aviation.

3. Coordination meetings between CAAC and NCAA may be held at mutually acceptable dates and intervals from date of conclusion of this MoU at a mutually agreed venue to discuss matters resulting there-from.

4. This MoU does not create any rights or obligations under international or domestic law.

5. This MoU will be effective on the date of the last signature of authorized officials representing the either Party.


